

GreatGrabz Maintenance Guidelines

Polished ("chrome" look) stainless steel bars Satin/brushed stainless steel bars Polished Brass (PVD plated) bars

To clean up after construction: paint, drywall mud, stain etc.:

Use a plastic or wood scraper to remove chunks or thick drops.

Acetone or Goof-Off will clean off most stubborn materials.

<u>Regular maintenance</u>: A soft cloth with mild detergent or a general shower cleaning product.

Rinse with warm water to remove any soap residue, then wipe dry.

Powder coated bars and Acrylic/Plastic bars

To clean up after construction: paint, drywall mud, stain etc.:

Use a plastic scraper or sharp stick to remove chunks or thick drops.

Paint thinner may clean off some materials.

If not, 600 grit wet/dry sand paper, followed by hand buffing with a car polishing compound or Gel-gloss (hardware store) will restore luster.

<u>Regular maintenance</u>: A soft cloth with mild detergent or a general shower cleaning product.(test this first in an inconspicuous area.)

Rinse with warm water to remove any soap residue, then wipe dry.

Teak (wood) bars

To clean up after construction: paint, drywall mud, stain etc.:

Use a plastic scraper or sharp stick to remove chunks or thick drops.

Paint thinner may clean off some materials.

If that darkens the wood in that spot, apply to the entire bar.

Lightly sanding and oiling the wood may be necessary.(test this first in an inconspicuous area.)

Regular maintenance: A soft cloth with a highly diluted detergent.

(try this first in an inconspicuous area.)

Rinse with warm water to remove any soap residue, then wipe dry.
